ORDINANCE 2020-06

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF LUTHER, OKLAHOMA, AMENDING PART 12, "PLANNING, ZONING, AND DEVELOPMENT," OF THE TOWN OF LUTHER CODE OF ORDINANCES, ADDING SECTION 12-305, "DEED APPROVALS, LOT SPLITS OR SUBDIVISION OF LAND;" AND SPECIFICALLY SETTING FORTH THE CRITERIA FOR DEED APPROVALS AND LOTS SPLITS; PROVIDING FOR REPEALER; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IS ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF LUTHER, OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. Section 12-305 of the Code of Ordinances of the Town of Luther, Oklahoma, is hereby added to read as follows:

SECTION 12-305. DEED APPROVALS, LOT SPLITS OR SUBDIVISION OF LAND.

- 1. No deed for the transfer or subdivision of a lot or land shall be valid and recordable except for that regarding a platted lot or otherwise approved as provided within this section. The Town Board, after recommendation from the Planning Commission, may approve deeds for the transfer of land by metes and bounds description less than five (5) acres, lot splits or subdivisions of land, when the following requirements have been met and documents provided:
 - a. When a survey of all the property described is submitted for review;
 - b. Verification of adequate provision for utilities;
 - c. Verification of access to the property by means of a public or private street and compliance with all other driveway and access ordinances.
 - d. Compliance with the zoning district regulations where the property is situated;
 - e. Compliance with building regulations;
 - f. Signed, notarized copies of the deeds to be filed; and
 - g. Certified copy of the deeds demonstrating ownership of the applicant to lot split.
- 2. Manufactured housing (R-3), Multi-family (R-4), Business/Commercial (B); or industrial (I) lot splits or subdivisions shall be not be approved until there is a plat submitted for review. Deed approvals or lot splits can be considered at the time of transfer as a first step to the platting process.
- 3. Any fee for the lot split application, process, and hearing is non-refundable, is payable at the time of application for lot split, and shall be as set out and as periodically modified by the Board of Trustees.
- **SECTION 2. REPEALER.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances conflicting or inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of any such conflict.

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by a Court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. EMERGENCY. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the Town of Luther and the inhabitants thereof that the provisions of this ordinance be put into full force and effect immediately, an emergency is hereby declared to exist by reason whereof, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage as provided by law.

PASSED AND APPROVED and the Emergency Clause voted upon separately and passed and approved this 9th day of June, 2020.



ORDINANCE NO. 2020-04

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF LUTHER, OKLAHOMA, AMENDING PART 8, "HEALTH AND SANITATION," OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE TOWN OF LUTHER, OKLAHOMA, AND SPECIFICALLY CHAPTER 7, "LAND APPLICATION OF BIOSOLIDS;" ADDING SECTION 8-701, "DEFINITIONS;" ADDING SECTION 8-702, "INTENT," WHICH SETS FORTH THE INTENT OF THE PROHIBITION OF LAND APPLICATION OF BIOSOLIDS; ADDING SECTION 8-703, "APPLICABILITY;" ADDING SECTION 8-704, "BIOSOLIDS PROHIBITED;" ADDING SECTION 8-705, "PENALTY;" WHICH PROVIDES THE PENALTY FOR VIOLATION; PROVIDING FOR REPEALER; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY

RECITALS

WHEREAS, biosolids are primarily organic materials produced during wastewater treatment; and

WHEREAS, The Environmental Protection Agency's 40 CFR Part 503, Standards for the Use and Disposal of Sewage Sludge (the Part 503 Rule), requires that wastewater solids be processed before they are land applied; and

WHEREAS, this processing is referred to as "stabilization" and helps minimize odor generation, destroys pathogens (disease causing organisms), and reduces vector attraction potential; and

WHEREAS, vectors (flies, mosquitoes, rodents, birds, etc.) can transmit diseases directly to humans or play a specific role in the life cycle of a pathogen as a host; and

WHEREAS, vector attraction reduction refers to processing which makes the biosolids less attractive to vectors thereby reducing the potential for transmitting diseases; and

WHEREAS, while Exceptional Quality biosolids products can be as safe as other agricultural and horticultural products and may be used without site restrictions, determining whether biosolids are of exceptional quality is problematic at best for small municipalities; and

WHEREAS, despite positive impacts to the environment, land application can have negative impacts on water, soil, and air if not practiced correctly; and

WHEREAS, negative impacts to water can result from the application of biosolids at rates that exceed the nutrient requirements of the vegetation, excess nutrients in the biosolids (primarily nitrogen compounds) can leach from the soil and reach groundwater, and runoff from rainfall may also carry excess nutrients to surface water; and

WHEREAS, Negative impacts to soil can result from mismanagement of a biosolids land application.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF LUTHER, OKLAHOMA:

SECTION I. Section 8-701 of the Code of Ordinances of the Town of Luther, Oklahoma, is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 8-701 DEFINITIONS:

For the purposes of this Chapter, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning:

Biosolids mean solid, semi-solid, or liquid residue generated during treatment of domestic sewage in a treatment works; and include domestic septage, scum, or solids removed in primary, secondary, or advanced wastewater treatment processes, and a material derived from biosolids. The term excludes biosolids products that are in a bag or container packaged for routine retail sales through regular retail outlets which are primarily used for residential purposes in limited quantities.

Treatment works means facilities installed for the purpose of treating, neutralizing, stabilizing, or disposing of sewage, industrial waste, or other wastes, including, but not limited to a plant, disposal field, lagoon, pumping station, constructed drainage ditch or surface water intercepting ditch, incinerator, area devoted to sanitary landfills, or other works.

SECTION II. Section 8-702 of the Code of Ordinances of the Town of Luther, Oklahoma, is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 8-702 INTENT:

- A. It is recognized that the land application of biosolids can pose a potential risk to public safety and environmental quality, and may not be appropriate, even when applied in accordance with federal and state regulations. Biosolids may contain heavy metals, pathogenic organisms, chemical pollutants, and synthetic organic compounds which may pose a risk to public health and the environment. Application of biosolids is an incompatible land use in the incorporated Town limits because of the smell, dust, and other immediate undesirable effects.
- B. Land application of biosolids can negatively affect the brand, reputation, and environmental health of the Town of Luther.
- C. It is, therefore, the intent of this Chapter, to prohibit land application of biosolids within the corporate limits of the Town.
- **SECTION III.** Section 8-703 of the Code of Ordinances of the Town of Luther, Oklahoma, is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 8-703 APPLICABILITY:

This Chapter applies to all private and public lands in the Town of Luther. Disposal of biosolids on municipal-owned land as part of a municipal treatment works is exempt from the provisions of this chapter.

SECTION IV. Section 8-704 of the Code of Ordinances of the Town of Luther, Oklahoma, is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 8-704 BIOSOLIDS PROHIBITED:

Land application of biosolids is prohibited within the corporate limits of the Town of Luther.

SECTION V. Section 8-705 of the Code of Ordinances of the Town of Luther, Oklahoma, is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 8-705 PENALTY:

Any person who violates Section 8-704 of this Chapter shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$750.00 for every day that the violation continues.

SECTION VI. All ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION VII. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance or any part thereof is for any reason found to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this ordinance or any part thereof.
